

Foreign High School Teacher Invitation Project

1. Purpose

As a collaborative effort between the various types of goodwill exchange the City of Nagoya has implemented with Sister and Friendship Cities and the Global 30^(*) project which Nagoya University will put into effect this year, we are inviting high school faculty members from the five cities with which Nagoya has sister and friendship city relations^(**) in order to deepen amicable interactions between sister and friendship cities as well as encourage and facilitate foreign students from high schools in each city to enter Nagoya University in near future.

2. Number of Participating Teachers

Two persons each from Nagoya's five sister and friendship cities

* Nagoya University may invite a small number of participants from other cities as well for this program.

3. Recommendation

Recommendation will be carried out with the cooperation of each city's sister city association or organization with sister city responsibilities counterpart of the International Relations Division of the Office of the Mayor of the City of Nagoya. Regarding the criteria of eligible high schools, consideration will be given to interest and activities concerning Japan and the Japanese language and/or the potential of student for study in undergraduate-level courses with which Nagoya University will provide completely in English from October 2011^(***). We are expecting that these teachers will contribute to the promotion of promising students for Nagoya University after they have returned to their home country.

In this respect, we particularly welcome career counselors and board of education members or persons in charge of foreign relations projects, either in high schools or in City's administration.

4. Invitation period

July 2010 (roughly one week)

5. Activities

- a. Observation of Nagoya University's education and school life in general for foreign students
- b. Friendly exchange with Nagoya University Affiliated Upper Secondary School
- c. Goodwill activities with the City of Nagoya

*Lectures and discussions are mainly in English.

(*1) A project by 13 universities in Japan to upgrade structures, including increasing and improving courses that can be studied solely in English, under the support of the national government to expand the number of foreign students.

(*2) Los Angeles, Mexico City, Nanjing, Sydney, and Turin

(*3) Automotive Engineering Program, Fundamental and Applied Physics Program, Chemistry Program, Biological Science Program, and Program in Social Sciences
